National suggestions to the next Joint Operation

- The beginning of the operation at national level should start the day before liaison officers will reach to the Temporary Coordination Center Mohacs. However in the first morning of the operational day the liaison officers will have already the results from previous day, so that the first working day would be more productive.
- With reference to the tasks, nothing to add besides one “Identify possible risks and threats” coming for instance from the third countries
- Methodology:
 - 1) **Understand the strategic direction** (Which are the strategic goals to be achieved and the operation objectives that support their attainments);
 - 2) **Understand the operational environment** (What is the larger context that will help us to determine our problem);

The analysis of the current and future operational environment, our expert group can use a political, military, economic, social, informational and other situational awareness framework, in order to analyse and determine relevant and critical relationships between the various subjects and specific nature of the threats.

3) **Define the problem** (What problem is the design intended to solve?)

Defining the problem begins with a review of the tendencies and potentials of all the concerned actors and identifying tensions among the existing conditions and the desired end state.

The answers of these three questions will support the development of an operational approach !

- Regarding data exchange form, I suggest to be introduced as well the final destination or the transit countries of the cruise ships in order to have a clear view of their movement over Danube River.
