Priority Area 1a of the Danube Region Strategy on Inland Waterways









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Targets for PA 1a

- (1) Increase the <u>cargo transport</u> on the river by 20% by 2020 compared to 2010.
- (2) Solve <u>obstacles to navigability</u>, taking into account the specific characteristics of each section of the Danube and its navigable tributaries and establish effective <u>waterway infrastructure management</u> by 2015.
- (3) Develop efficient <u>multimodal terminals at river ports</u> along the Danube and its navigable tributaries to connect inland waterways with rail and road transport by 2020.
- (4) Implement harmonised <u>River Information Services</u> (RIS) on the Danube and its navigable tributaries and ensure the international <u>exchange of RIS data</u> preferably by 2015.
- (5) Solve the shortage of <u>qualified personnel</u> and harmonize <u>education standards</u> in inland navigation in the Danube region by 2020, taking duly into account the social dimension of the respective measures.

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Administrative Processes – status



- ✓ New initiative within PA 1a in cooperation with PA11 on Security
- ✓ Administrative processes and paperwork are seen as a significant competitive disadvantage for IWT on the Danube and its tributaries
- ✓ Background: not all Danube riparian states are in the EU; not all EU states are in the Schengen area, i.e. necessary border checks for passengers & crews; required customs clearance for imports & exports
- ✓ First dedicated meeting on 25 September 2013 to identify the main administrative barriers which cause the highest costs and lead to the highest time losses

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Summary sector feedback – border controls I

Customs

- ✓ Control of the fuel declarations (different) procedures, customs clearance after bunkering and resulting waiting times)
- ✓ Required customs clearance at each port entry and exit – even for domestic transports (opening hours of customs offices in ports)
- Customs clearance in sea ports (time consuming)
- List of supplies for control (level of data, requested data)
- Landing fees during customs controls













Summary sector feedback – border controls II

Border police

- Control at the EU external borders (opening hours, waiting times)
- Passport control in ports (opening hours)

Navigational Surveillance/ Authorities responsible for disaster prevention

- ADN controls (multiple controls, different procedures)
- Controls of ship certifications (different procedures)
- Official closures of navigation by authorities during low water periods
- Draught controls







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Summary sector feedback – recommendations

- ✓ Questionnaires on satisfaction with the control procedures
- ✓ Harmonized training regarding ADN for control bodies (harmonised control mechanisms along Upper, Middle and Lower Danube)
- ✓ Construction of landing sites/pontoons for the control of motorized cargo vessels and small convoys at the border
- ✓ 24 hours service at the border and customs inspection or controls outside the opening hours upon appointment in advance
- ✓ Prompt execution of phytosanitary controls (also after 4 pm)
- ✓ Standardized forms (crew list, documents for border and customs inspection)
- ✓ Revision of the list of supplies







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
