Joint Operation national tasks and methodology

- Identification of possible risks and threats
- Enhance efficiency of the exchange of information between BCP "Giurgiulesti Port" - National Coordinating Centre and Temporary Coordination Centre from Mohacs.
- Identify possible trends of violation of rules for crossing of the border
- Ensure an integrated border management
- Ensure an efficient exchange of data and operational information with neighboring countries









Forces used in Joint Operation

- Authorities involved: Border Police, Customs
 Service and Harbor Master Giurgiulesti
- Number of officials involved: 5
- Duty boats involved: 2
- Duty cars involved: 2

SUMMARY OF CHECKS CARRIED OUT:

Tugboats, freight ships: 4

Number of persons checked: 27

Number of documents checked: 27

No major incidents were detected!









Examples of information exchange during Joint Operation

- Number of persons checked
- Number of documents checked
- Means of transport checked
- Loads transported and the destination of boats
- Name of the boats and their flag









Conclusions & experiences from Joint Operation

- Large flow of people from Asian countries towards EU countries with valid travel documents but without a valid visa or any other document, for immigration purposes;
- A lot of administrative fines imposed which means that passengers and the crew members break the rules of crossing the border of a EU Member State.
